They have come together to send a strong message to the G8 leaders as they meet at the Lough Erne resort, calling for them to take urgent action to tackle some of the root causes of hunger in our world. This service, on the eve of the G8, will be an opportunity to pray and act in solidarity with the one in eight people who go hungry every night and to add your voice to those calling for action at the G8 summit.
